

**Public Notice – Request for Comment
Rescission of Ohio Administrative Code (OAC) Chapter 3745-72**

Notice is hereby given that the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency, Division of Air Pollution Control (DAPC) is planning to rescind the rules contained in Ohio Administrative Code (OAC) Chapter 3745-72 which establish the low Reid vapor pressure (RVP) fuel requirements. These rules are no longer necessary, as U.S. EPA approved the removal of the low RVP fuel requirements from Ohio's State Implementation Plan (SIP) in the Cincinnati and Dayton areas on April 7, 2017.

As part of the rule-making process, DAPC is required by Section 121.39 of the Ohio Revised Code to consult with organizations that represent political subdivisions, environmental interests, business interests, and others affected by the rules. The DAPC is offering your organization the opportunity to comment on this rule before the division formally proposes them.

Pursuant to Part D of Title I of the Clean Air Act, Ohio EPA is required to establish a SIP for the attainment and maintenance of the National Ambient Air Quality Standards (NAAQS). The above-mentioned rules are a part of Ohio's SIP and the proposed amendments will be submitted to USEPA as a modification of the SIP.
