Dear Mr. Vandersall:

The Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (Ohio EPA) Division of Solid and Infectious Waste Management (DSIWM) Northeast District Office (NEDO) received a document from Countywide RDF (Facility) titled *Statistical Analysis Program Revision 6 (Statistical Analysis Program) for Groundwater Quality Monitoring*. It is dated November 2010 and was received at NEDO on November 24, 2010.

The revised document was submitted to Ohio EPA as an Ohio Administrative Code (OAC) Rule 3745-27-10(C)(7)(g) request to update background data at the Facility's ground water monitoring wells. Historically, the statistical analysis of ground water monitoring data acquired at MW-123R at Countywide RDF had indicated the presence of statistically significant differences for potassium and chloride. Upon further scrutiny of the data and provided by OAC Rule 3745-27-10(D)(7)(c)(ii), Countywide RDF has demonstrated that an alternate source (natural/spatial variability) was responsible for the initial statistically significant differences and that the initial statistically significant differences were, in fact, false positives.

Pursuant to Ohio Administrative Code (OAC) Rule 3745-7-10(C)(7)(g), background data can only be added in blocks of data resulting from the analysis of four or more statistically independent samples after the data have been statistically compared to current background data and no statistical differences are detected, unless another method is deemed acceptable by the director.

Ohio EPA has reviewed the information provided and concurs that this data can be added to the background data group for MW-123R. Therefore, pursuant to OAC Rule 3745-27-10(C)(7)(g), the Facility is hereby authorized to update the background database as detailed in the November 2010 document.

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You are hereby notified that this action of the Director is final and may be appealed to the Environmental Review Appeals Commission pursuant to Section 3745.04 of the Ohio Revised Code. The appeal must be in writing and set forth the action complained of and the grounds upon which the appeal is based. The appeal must be filed with the Commission within thirty (30) days after notice of the Director's action. The appeal must be accompanied by a filing fee of \$70.00, made payable to "Ohio Treasurer Kevin Boyce," which the Commission, in its discretion, may reduce if by affidavit you demonstrate that payment of the full amount of the fee would cause extreme hardship. Notice of the filing of the appeal shall be filed with the Director within three (3) days of filing with the Commission. Ohio EPA requests that a copy of the appeal be served upon the Ohio Attorney General's Office, Environmental Enforcement Section.
