Dear Commissioner Wiggam and Ms. Everett:

The Director of the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (Director) has reviewed and approved the ratified draft solid waste management plan update (Plan) for the Stark-Tuscarawas-Wayne Joint Solid Waste Management District (District). Director's Final Findings and Orders approving the Plan are enclosed with this letter. Attachment 1 is a summary of the implementation schedule that was derived from the District's Plan.

The District should proceed to implement its approved Plan in accordance with the implementation schedule and timeline contained in the approved Plan and in Attachment 1 to the enclosed Director's Final Findings and Orders. Please be advised that Ohio Revised Code (ORC) Section 3734.55(C)(4) also requires the Policy Committee to "...annually review implementation of the approved plan... and report its findings and recommendations regarding implementation to the board of county commissioners or board of directors of the district."

You are hereby notified that this action of the Director is final and may be appealed to the Environmental Review Appeals Commission pursuant to ORC Section 3745.04. The appeal must be in writing and set forth the action complained of and the grounds upon which the appeal is based. The appeal must be filed with the Commission within thirty (30) days after notice of the Director's action. The appeal must be accompanied by a filing fee of \$70.00 made payable to "Treasurer, State of Ohio." The Commission, in its discretion, may reduce the fee if by affidavit it is demonstrated that payment of the full amount of the fee would cause extreme hardship. Notice of the filing of the appeal shall be filed with the Director within three (3) days of filing with the Commission. Ohio EPA requests that a copy of the appeal be served upon the



I. JURISDICTION

These Director's Final Findings and Orders (Orders) are issued to the Stark-Tuscarawas-Wayne Joint Solid Waste Management District (District), pursuant to the authority vested in the Director of the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (Ohio EPA) under Ohio Revised Code (ORC) Section 3734.55(C).

II. PARTIES

These Orders shall be binding upon the District.

III. DEFINITIONS

Unless otherwise stated, all terms used in these Orders shall have the same meanings as defined in ORC Chapter 3734 and the rules promulgated thereunder.

IV. FINDINGS

The director of Ohio EPA has determined the following findings:

1. Pursuant to ORC Section 3734.56(C), the policy committee of a solid waste management district (SWMD) that was ordered to implement and is operating under a solid waste management plan prepared by Ohio EPA may prepare, adopt, and submit an amended solid waste management plan to replace the plan prepared by Ohio EPA. The SWMD shall submit its draft amended solid waste management plan to Ohio EPA only within the 180 days immediately preceding the triennial anniversary of the date the director of Ohio EPA ordered the SWMD to implement the plan prepared by Ohio EPA.

2. On December 22, 2006, the Director of Ohio EPA issued Orders to the District ordering the District to implement a solid waste management plan prepared by Ohio EPA. To be in compliance with ORC Section 3734.56(C), the District's Policy Committee was required to submit its draft, amended solid waste management plan to Ohio EPA on or after June 25, 2009 and on or before December 21, 2009.
3. On September 14, 2009, Ohio EPA received a draft amended solid waste management plan from the District's Policy Committee.
4. Pursuant to ORC Section 3734.55, the director of Ohio EPA is required to provide the policy committee of a SWMD with a written, nonbinding advisory opinion regarding a draft solid waste management plan and any recommended changes to it that the director considers necessary to effect its approval.
5. On October 27, 2009, Ohio EPA mailed a written, nonbinding advisory opinion concerning the draft amended solid waste management plan received on September 14, 2009 to the District's Policy Committee.
6. Pursuant to ORC Section 3734.55, the policy committee of a SWMD is required to submit a draft solid waste management plan that has been ratified in accordance with the criteria established in Division (B) of ORC Section 3734.55 to the director of Ohio EPA to be reviewed for compliance with Divisions (A), (B), (D), and (E)(1) of ORC Section 3734.53.
7. On November 12, 2010, Ohio EPA received a ratified, draft, amended solid waste management plan from the District's Policy Committee.
8. The director has determined that the District's ratified, draft, amended solid waste management plan is in compliance with Divisions (A), (B), (D), and (E)(1) of Section 3734.53 of the ORC.
9. Pursuant to ORC Section 3734.56(C), when approving a solid waste management plan prepared by a SWMD, that is replacing a solid waste management plan prepared by Ohio EPA, the director of Ohio EPA is required to issue an order revoking the Orders issued to the SWMD requiring the SWMD to implement the solid waste management plan prepared by Ohio EPA.

V. ORDERS

1. The Orders issued by the director of Ohio EPA to the District on December 22, 2006 are hereby revoked.

2. The District's ratified, draft, amended plan that was received by Ohio EPA on November 12, 2010 is hereby approved.
3. The District shall proceed to implement its approved solid waste management plan in accordance with the strategies, programs, and activities described in the ratified, draft, amended solid waste management plan and contained in the implementation schedule included as Attachment 1 to these Orders.

VI. OTHER APPLICABLE LAWS

All actions required to be taken pursuant to these Orders shall be undertaken in accordance with the requirements of all applicable local, state, and federal laws and regulations.

VII. RESERVATION OF RIGHTS

Nothing contained herein shall be construed to prevent Ohio EPA from seeking legal or equitable relief to enforce the terms of these Orders or from taking other administrative, legal, or equitable action as deemed appropriate and necessary, including seeking penalties against the District for noncompliance with these Orders.

Nothing contained herein shall be construed to prevent Ohio EPA from exercising its lawful authority to require the District to perform additional activities pursuant to ORC Chapter 3734 or any other applicable laws in the future. Nothing herein shall restrict the right of the District to raise any administrative, legal, or equitable claim or defense with respect to such further actions which Ohio EPA may seek to require of the District. Nothing in these Orders shall be construed to limit the authority of Ohio EPA to seek relief for violations which may occur.

VIII. EFFECTIVE DATE

The effective date of these Orders is the date these Orders were entered into the Ohio EPA Director's Journal.
