Ohio Administrative Code Rule 3745-27-10(D)(2)
Approval of Request for Variance of Ground Water Monitoring**

Dear Mr. Terrell:

On June 9, 2010, the Ohio Environmental protection Agency (Ohio EPA), Division of Solid and Infectious Waste Management (DSIWM), Southwest District Office (SWDO) received a letter titled "Request for Variance of Ground Water Monitoring/Cedarville Landfill," dated June 7, 2010, for the closed Village of Cedarville Landfill (Facility). This letter was submitted by the Village of Cedarville and requests, in accordance with Ohio Administrative Code (OAC) Rule 3745-27-10(D)(2), a variance of ground water monitoring analysis for deletion of volatile organic compounds from the Appendix I parameters.

Pursuant to OAC Rule 3745-27-10(D)(2), the owner or operator "may propose, in writing, to delete any of the appendix I monitoring parameters to be used to meet the requirements of paragraphs (D)(5) to (D)(8) of this rule. The director may approve the alternative list of appendix I monitoring parameters if the removed parameters are not reasonably expected to be in or derived from the waste contained or deposited in the sanitary landfill facility. Upon approval by the director or his authorized representative, the owner or operator may use the alternative list."

Based upon the review of the Facility's request, Ohio EPA approves the removal of Appendix I volatile organic compound parameters (constituents 16 through 62) from further semi-annual ground water monitoring in monitoring wells MW-1, MW-2 and MW-3 at the Facility. The Facility shall continue monitoring all wells in the monitoring system for parameters 1-15 and 63 through 78 of Appendix I on a semi-annual basis in accordance with OAC Rule 3745-27-10.

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You are hereby notified that this action of the Director of Environmental Protection (Director) is final and may be appealed to the Environmental Review Appeals Commission pursuant to Ohio Revised Code Section 3745.04. The appeal must be in writing and set forth the action complained of and the grounds upon which the appeal is based. The appeal must be filed with the Commission within thirty (30) days after notice of the Director's action. The appeal must be accompanied by a filing fee of \$70.00 made payable to "Treasurer, State of Ohio." The Commission, in its discretion, may reduce the fee if by affidavit it is demonstrated that payment of the full amount of the fee would cause extreme hardship. Notice of the filing of the appeal shall be filed with the Director within three (3) days of filing with the Commission. Ohio EPA requests that a copy of the appeal be served upon the Ohio Attorney General's Office, Environmental Enforcement Section.
