

**Re: Conesville RSW Landfill, Coshocton County
Ohio Administrative Code (OAC) Rule 3745-30-08(D)(13) Approval**

Dear Ms. Zella:

On January 4, 2011, the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (Ohio EPA), Division of Materials & Waste Management (DMWM), Southeast District Office (SEDO), received a document titled "Conesville RW Landfill Landfill-PTI No. 06-07748 Semiannual Groundwater Report -October 2010," for the Conesville RSW Landfill (Facility) located in Coshocton County. This document was submitted by American Electric Power, on behalf of the Facility, and contains a request pursuant to OAC Rule 3745-30-08(D)(13) to allow ground water monitoring well P-9(A) at the Facility to return in the detection monitoring program.

Pursuant to OAC Rule 3745-30-08(D)(13), If the owner or operator determines, based on the results of the sampling required by paragraph (D)(10), (D)(11), or (D)(12) of this rule, that there has not been an increase above background levels of waste-derived constituents at any monitoring well down gradient of the facility, then the owner or operator shall request that the director approve reinstatement of the detection monitoring program described in paragraphs (C) and (D)(1) to (D)(8) of this rule. Until the director or his authorized representative approves reinstatement of the detection monitoring program, the owner or operator shall continue to comply with paragraphs (D)(10) to (D)(12) and (E) of this rule.

According to the January 4, 2011 document, analysis of the ground water detection monitoring data indicated that monitoring well P-9(A) has a chloride level of 6.0 mg/l which is within the prediction interval of 6.0 mg/l for chloride and the statistical data from P-9(A) meets the requirement of OAC rule 3745-30-08(D)(13).

Ohio EPA has reviewed the applicable information and concurs with the demonstration. Therefore, pursuant to OAC Rule 3745-27-08(D)(13), the owner or operator is hereby authorized to continue the detection monitoring program at the Facility for monitoring well P-9(A).

Should future or existing ground water sampling results indicate statistically significant changes in ground water monitoring parameters, the owner or operator will be required to either enter into assessment monitoring in accordance with OAC Rule 3745-30-08(E) or obtain approval to remain in the detection monitoring program.

You are hereby notified that this action of the Director of Environmental Protection (Director) is final and may be appealed to the Environmental Review Appeals Commission pursuant to Ohio Revised Code Section 3745.04. The appeal must be in writing and set forth the action complained of and the grounds upon which the appeal is based. The appeal must be filed with the Commission within thirty (30) days after notice of the Director's action. The appeal must be accompanied by a filing fee of \$70.00 made payable to "Treasurer, State of Ohio." The Commission, in its discretion, may reduce the fee if by affidavit it is demonstrated that payment of the full amount of the fee would cause extreme hardship. Notice of the filing of the appeal shall be filed with the Director within three (3) days of filing with the Commission. Ohio EPA requests that a copy of the appeal be served upon the Ohio Attorney General's Office, Environmental Enforcement Section.
