**Re: Allied Landfill, I. D. # 82-00-08, Vinton County
Ohio Administrative Code (OAC) Rule 3745-27-10 (C)(7)(G) Approval**

Dear Ms. Jones:

On March 15, 2011, the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (Ohio EPA), Division of Solid and Infectious Waste Management (DSIWM), Southeast District Office (SEDO), received a document titled *Statistical Analysis Program for Ground-Water Quality Monitoring Allied Landfill*, Revision 9, (Revision 9) dated March 10, 2011, for the Allied Landfill (Facility) located in Vinton County. This document was submitted by Eagon & Associates on behalf of Waste Management, pursuant to OAC Rule 3745-27-10(C)(7)(g), to update the statistical background periods for the detection monitoring wells and to request approval from the director to incorporate statistical exceedances for two values of chloride for well SP-1, and four values of sodium for well MW-5.

The March 10, 2011, document submitted by Eagon & Associates indicates that well SP-1 had two exceedances for chloride and well MW-5 had four exceedances for sodium during the observation period. These statistical exceedances were demonstrated to be due to natural variation in ground water quality in Revision 9. Ohio EPA concurred with that demonstration that the referenced results were due to natural variation in ground water quality and were not the result of impacts from the Facility in correspondence dated August 17, 2010.

Pursuant to OAC Rule 3745-27-10(C)(7)(g), the owner/operator is hereby authorized to include the results for chloride into the background period for well SP-1 and for sodium for well MW-5 as referenced on Page 15 and 16 of *Statistical Analysis Program for Ground-Water Quality Monitoring Allied Landfill*, Revision 9, dated March 10, 2011, for Allied Landfill located in Vinton County. Subsequent statistical analysis should be performed as described within the March 10, 2011, Statistical Analysis Program.



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You are hereby notified that this action of the Director of Environmental Protection (Director) is final and may be appealed to the Environmental Review Appeals Commission pursuant to Ohio Revised Code Section 3745.04. The appeal must be in writing and set forth the action complained of and the grounds upon which the appeal is based. The appeal must be filed with the Commission within thirty (30) days after notice of the Director's action. The appeal must be accompanied by a filing fee of \$70.00 made payable to "Treasurer, State of Ohio." The Commission, in its discretion, may reduce the fee if by affidavit it is demonstrated that payment of the full amount of the fee would cause extreme hardship. Notice of the filing of the appeal shall be filed with the Director within three (3) days of filing with the Commission. Ohio EPA requests that a copy of the appeal be served upon the Ohio Attorney General's Office, Environmental Enforcement Section.
