Dear Mr. Bell:

On November 5, 2008, Ohio EPA received an amended post-closure plan from Kelsey-Hayes Company for the closed landfill located at 2400 Charles Street, Portsmouth, Ohio. The amended post-closure plan was submitted pursuant to rule 3745-66-18 of the Ohio Administrative Code (OAC) in order to demonstrate that Kelsey-Hayes Company's proposal for amended post-closure complies with the requirements of OAC rules 3745-66-11, 3745-66-12, and 3745-66-18.

The owner or operator and the public were given the opportunity to submit written comments regarding the amended post-closure plan in accordance with the hazardous waste rule requirements. No public comments were received by Ohio EPA.

Based upon review of Kelsey-Hayes Company's submittal, I conclude that the amended post-closure plan for the closed Kelsey-Hayes landfill, located at 2400 Charles Street, Portsmouth, Ohio, as modified herein, meets the performance standard contained in OAC rule 3745-66-11 and complies with the pertinent parts of OAC rules 3745-66-12, 3745-66-18, 3745-54, and 3745-55, as well as final ground water monitoring and response requirements, and cap maintenance requirements.

The amended post-closure plan submitted to Ohio EPA on November 5, 2008 by Kelsey-Hayes Company is hereby approved.

Compliance with the approved closure plan is expected and Ohio EPA will monitor such compliance. Ohio EPA expressly reserves the right to take action, pursuant to chapters 3734. and 6111. of the Ohio Revised Code, and other applicable law, to enforce such compliance and to seek appropriate remedies in the event of noncompliance with the provisions and modifications of this approved post-closure plan. Please be advised that approval of this amended post-closure plan does not release Kelsey-Hayes Company from any responsibilities regarding corrective action for all releases of hazardous waste or constituents from any waste management unit, regardless of the time at which waste was placed in the unit.

You are hereby notified that this action of the Director is final and may be appealed to the Environmental Review Appeals Commission pursuant to Section 3745.04 of the Ohio Revised Code. The appeal must be in writing and set forth the action complained of and the grounds upon which the appeal is based. The appeal must be filed with the Commission within thirty (30) days after notice of the Director's action. The appeal must be accompanied by a filing fee of \$70.00 which the Commission, in its discretion, may reduce if by affidavit you demonstrate that payment of the full amount of the fee would cause extreme hardship. Notice of the filing of the appeal shall be filed with the Director within three (3) days of filing with the Commission. Ohio EPA requests that a copy of the appeal be served upon the Ohio Attorney General's Office, Environmental Enforcement Section. 

When closure is completed, OAC rule 3745-66-15 requires the owner or operator of a facility to submit to the Director of Ohio EPA, certification by the owner or operator and an independent, registered professional engineer, that the facility has been closed in accordance with the approved closure plan. The certification by the owner or operator shall include the statement found in OAC rule 3745-50-42(D). These certifications should be submitted to:

Ohio EPA, Division of Hazardous Waste Management, strongly encourages you to consider pollution prevention options for any processes at your facility that generate waste.
