Re: **Evergreen Recycling and Disposal Facility, Wood County
Ohio Administrative Code (OAC) Rule 3745-27-10(D)(3)**

Dear Mr. Brady:

On June 6, 2002, Eagon and Associates, Inc. submitted to the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (Ohio EPA) a request, pursuant to Ohio Administrative Code (OAC) Rule 3745-27-10(D)(3), for an alternate inorganic ground water monitoring parameter list for the Evergreen Recycling and Disposal Facility (Facility). The Facility is located in the City of Northwood, Wood County, Ohio.

The request for an alternate ground water monitoring parameter list for this Facility was submitted as part of the 2002 First Semiannual Ground-Water Results and Statistical Analyses for Evergreen Recycling and Disposal Facility. The submittal was dated June 6, 2002 and received by Ohio EPA on June 7, 2002.

The alternate inorganic ground water parameter list for this Facility is hereby approved by Ohio EPA with the following conditions:

1. This approval is for an alternate inorganic ground water monitoring parameter list only for MW-16UT and MW-17UT monitored by the Facility.
2. Potassium (76) and total alkalinity (71) shall replace sodium (65) and chloride (64) at MW-16UT and MW-17UT as inorganic indicator parameters.
3. At any time sodium and/or chloride concentrations return to historic background levels, as defined by comparison to background concentrations up to the year 2001, Evergreen Recycling and Disposal Facility shall return to using sodium and/or chloride as inorganic statistical indicator parameters.
4. The PQL for potassium shall be lowered to 0.15 mg/l as proposed in the Facility's RCRA cell ground water detection monitoring program, in order to use the lowest concentration level that can be reliably achieved and to make it more sensitive in detecting a significant statistical increase .

You are hereby notified that this action of the director is final and may be appealed to the Environmental Review Appeals Commission pursuant to Ohio Revised Code Section 3745.04. The appeal must be in writing and set forth the action complained of and the ground upon which the appeal is based. The appeal shall be filed with the Commission within 30 days after notice of the action. Notice of the filing of the appeal shall be filed with the director of environmental protection within three (3) days after the appeal is filed with the Commission.
