Dear Mr. Burden:

On August 19, 2002, the Southeast District Office (SEDO) of the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (Ohio EPA) received a report from Commonwealth Aluminum Concast, Inc. (Commonwealth Aluminum), regarding ground water monitoring at your closed industrial waste landfill in Tuscarawas County, Ohio. This report requested an alternate ground water monitoring parameter list for the facility. Representatives from the Division of Drinking and Ground Waters (DDAGW) and the Division of Solid and Infectious Waste Management (DSIWM) have reviewed the aforementioned document.

Based upon the results from the initial sampling event conducted May 23, 2002, and the April 2001 Final Closure Certification/Post-Closure Plan, the following site specific list of parameters shall be monitored: aluminum, ammonia, arsenic, barium, calcium, chloride, copper, iron, manganese, nickel, potassium, selenium, sodium, field pH, temperature, and conductivity. Additionally, leachate shall be sampled for all Appendix I parameters annually.

This parameter list is hereby approved for a period of one year. Commonwealth Aluminum may request another alternate parameter list at that time. If another alternate parameter list is not approved, Commonwealth Aluminum shall resume monitoring in accordance with OAC Rule 3745-29-10(E).
