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

Ohio Administrative Code (OAC) Rule 3745-27-10(D)(7)(c) Approval

Dear Mr. Butler,

On May 13, 2004, Ohio Environmental Protection Agency received a document titled "Statistical Analysis for Ground-Water Detection Monitoring, 2004 First Semiannual Results, Bond Road Landfill Site, Inc." Bond Road Landfill, Whitewater Twp. Hamilton Co. The document were submitted on behalf of the Bond Road Site Inc, by the consulting firm of Eagon & Associates Inc.

The document contains the ground water sampling results and the statistical analysis from the March 2-3, 2004 ground water sampling event. One verified statistical exceedance was noted for sodium (90.8 mg/l) at well M-14, the submittal also includes an OAC 3745-27-10(D)(7)(c)(ii) demonstration that the exceedance was not the result of a release from the landfill.

Upon review of the information submitted, Ohio EPA does concur that the variation in the ground water from ground water monitoring well M-14 is not a result of a release from the landfill.

Pursuant to OAC Rule 3745-27-10(D)(7)(c), the owner /operator is hereby authorized to continue the detection monitoring program at Bond Road Landfill for monitoring well M-14, in accordance with OAC Rule 3745-27-10(C) and (D). Upon the effective date of this approval, the owner/operator is not required to comply with OAC 3745-27-10(E) and (F) for the aforementioned sampling event in regard to well M -14.

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Should future or existing ground water sampling results indicate statistically significant increases in ground water monitoring parameters, the facility owner/operator will be required to enter into assessment monitoring in accordance with **OAC Rule 3745-27-10(E)** or obtain an approval to remain in the detection monitoring program.

You are hereby notified that this action of the Director of Environmental Protection (Director) is final and may **be** appealed to the Environmental Review Appeals Commission pursuant to Ohio Revised Code (ORC) Section 3745.04. The appeal must be in writing and set forth the action complained of and the grounds upon which the appeal **is** based. The appeal shall be filed with the Commission within thirty (30) days after notice of the action. Notice of the filing of the appeal shall be filed with the director within three (3) days after the appeal is filed with the Commission. An appeal may be filed with the Commission at the following address:
