Ohio Administrative Code (OAC) Rule 3745-27-10(D)(7)(c)(ii) Authorization**

Dear Mr. Gehle:

The Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (Ohio **EPA**) received the Ohio Administrative Code (OAC) Rule 3745-27-10(D)(7)(c)(ii) demonstration for SW-12, for the March 15-17, 2004 semi-annual sampling event and the May 12, 2004 resampling event at the County Environmental of Wyandot Landfill (Facility). The report was dated June 11, 2004 and received on June 18, 2004. This demonstration was submitted in accordance with OAC Rule 3745-27-10(D)(7)(c)(ii) due to a statistically significant increase for barium at SW-12.

Pursuant to OAC Rule 3745-27-10(D)(7)(c)(ii), the owner or operator may demonstrate that a source other than the facility caused the contamination, or the increase resulted from error during sampling, analysis, or evaluation, or natural variation in the groundwater. The June 11, **2004** demonstration concluded that the statistically significant increase of barium at SW-12 was due to natural variability in the ground water quality.

Ohio EPA concurs with the demonstration and approves continuation of the detection monitoring program in accordance with OAC Rule 3745-27-10(D)(7)(c)(ii) for barium at sw-12.

Should future or existing ground water sampling indicate statistically significant increases in ground water quality for other parameters, the facility owner/operator will be required to enter into assessment monitoring in accordance with OAC Rule 3745-27-10(E), or obtain similar approval to remain in detection monitoring.

You are hereby notified that this action of the Director is final and may be appealed to the Environmental Review Appeals Commission pursuant to Ohio Revised Code Section 3745.04. The appeal must be in writing and set forth the action complained of and the ground upon which the appeal is based.


