**RE: Bond Road Landfill, Hamilton County  
Ohio Administrative Code (OAC) Rule 3745-27-10(C)(7)(g) Approval**

Dear Mr. Butler:

On December 12, 2006, the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (Ohio EPA), Division of Solid and Infectious Waste Management (DSIWM), Southwest District Office (SWDO), received a document titled "Statistical Analysis For Ground-Water Detection Monitoring, 2006 Second Semiannual Results, Bond Road Site, Inc." for the Bond Road Landfill, Whitewater Township, Hamilton County, Ohio. This document was submitted by Christopher J. Cobel of Eagon & Associates, Inc., on behalf of Bond Road Site, Inc.

According to the document some statistical exceedances are proposed for inclusion as background data by Bond Road Site, Inc. Pursuant to Ohio Administrative Code 3745-27-10(C)(7)(g) background data can be added only in blocks of data resulting from the analysis of four or more statistically independent samples after the data have been statistically compared to current background data and no statistical differences are detected, unless another method is deemed acceptable to the director.

Ohio EPA, Division of Drinking and Ground Water (DDAGW) has reviewed the proposal and concurs that this data can be added to the background database. All the proposed data except for sodium from monitoring well M-14 are within or less than the concentration range of corresponding upgradient wells. Sodium in M-14 has previously been determined not to be a release from the landfill. Therefore, pursuant to OAC Rule 3745-27-10(C)(7)(g), Bond Road Site, Inc. is authorized to add those statistical exceedances identified in the statistical plan to the background database.

You are hereby notified that this action of the Director of Ohio EPA (Director) is final and may be appealed to the Environmental Review Appeals Commission pursuant to Section 3745.04 of the Ohio Revised Code. The appeal must be in writing and set forth the action complained of and the grounds upon which the appeal is based. The appeal must be filed with the Commission within thirty (30) days after notice of the Director's action. The appeal

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must be accompanied by a filing fee of \$70.00 which the Commission, in its discretion, may reduce if by affidavit you demonstrate that payment of the full amount of the fee would cause extreme hardship. Notice of the filing of the appeal shall be filed with the Director within three (3) days of filing with the Commission. Ohio EPA requests that a copy of the appeal be served upon the Ohio Attorney General's Office, Environmental Enforcement Section.
