

I think there is a contaminated property in my neighborhood. What can I do about it?

First, find out within which Ohio EPA District Office the property you're concerned about is located (*see map below*). Once you have determined the district, you should contact the Division of Environmental Response and Revitalization for that district. DERR will be able to let you know whether or not the property is under investigation by Ohio EPA or, if not, can address your concerns about the property.
